Materials Needed

- Medium-weight yarn in pastel shades: pink, blue, yellow, cream
- 3.5 mm crochet hook
- Black and pink embroidery thread
- Yarn needle
- Scissors
- Fiberfill stuffing (optional)

Stitches Glossary

- ch: chain
- sl st: slip stitch
- sc: single crochet
- dc: double crochet
- inc: increase (2 sc in the same stitch)

Crocheting the Cat Face Square - Step by Step

- 1. Magic Ring: Ch 4, join with sl st to form ring.
- 2. Round 1: Ch 1, 6 sc into ring. Join.
- 3. Round 2: 2 sc in each stitch (12 sc).
- 4. Round 3: *1 sc, inc* repeat around (18 sc).
- 5. Round 4: *2 sc, inc* repeat around (24 sc).
- 6. Round 5: *3 sc, inc* repeat around (30 sc).
- 7. Transform into square:
 - In corners: (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) into same stitch
 - On sides: 1 dc into each stitch.
- 8. Fasten off neatly.

Adding the Cat Ears and Face

EARS:

1. Ch 5.

- 2. Row 1: sc in 2nd ch, hdc in next, dc in next, sl st in last.
- 3. Make two ears and sew them symmetrically on top of the square.

FACE:

- Embroider two small black eyes.
- Embroider a pink triangle for the nose centered between the eyes.

Joining Squares and Finishing the Blanket

- 1. Arrange your cat face squares into rows.
- 2. Join them using whip stitch or single crochet joining.
- 3. Add a border:
 - Round 1: sc evenly around the blanket, 3 sc in each corner.
 - Round 2: optional scalloped border (*5 dc in same stitch, skip 2, sc*).

Beginner Tips

- Use stitch markers for corner stitches.
- Block your finished squares for a uniform look.
- Mix pastel shades for a baby blanket style.


Finished Cat Face Crochet Blanket Example
