

Mitered Granny Square - Complete Tutorial with Diagram

Materials Needed

- Medium-weight yarn in two or more shades (light and dark recommended)
- 4.0 mm crochet hook
- Scissors
- Yarn needle for finishing

Stitches Used

- ch: chain
- sl st: slip stitch
- dc: double crochet
- 3-dc cluster: group of three double crochets in the same stitch or space

Instructions - Center Start

1. Start with a magic ring or ch 4 and join to form a ring.
2. Ch 3 (counts as first dc), 2 dc into ring, ch 2 (corner),
 3 dc, ch 2 repeat 3 more times. Join with sl st to top of ch-3.
3. You now have 4 clusters and 4 corner spaces.

Instructions - Working in Rounds

1. Sl st to the next corner space.
2. Ch 3 (counts as dc), 2 dc in same space, ch 2, 3 dc again (this is a corner).
3. In the next space between clusters, work 3 dc.
4. In the next corner: 3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc.
5. Repeat for remaining sides and join with sl st.

Color Change & Final Rounds

1. You can change colors every 1 or 2 rounds to create the striped effect.

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2. Always start a new color in a corner for a clean join.
3. Continue until desired size.
4. Fasten off and weave in all ends.

Tips for Beginners

- Keep your chain-2 corners consistent to maintain square shape.
- Use stitch markers in corners if needed.
- Gently block your square to shape it if needed.
- Choose contrasting yarn colors to enhance the diagonal effect.

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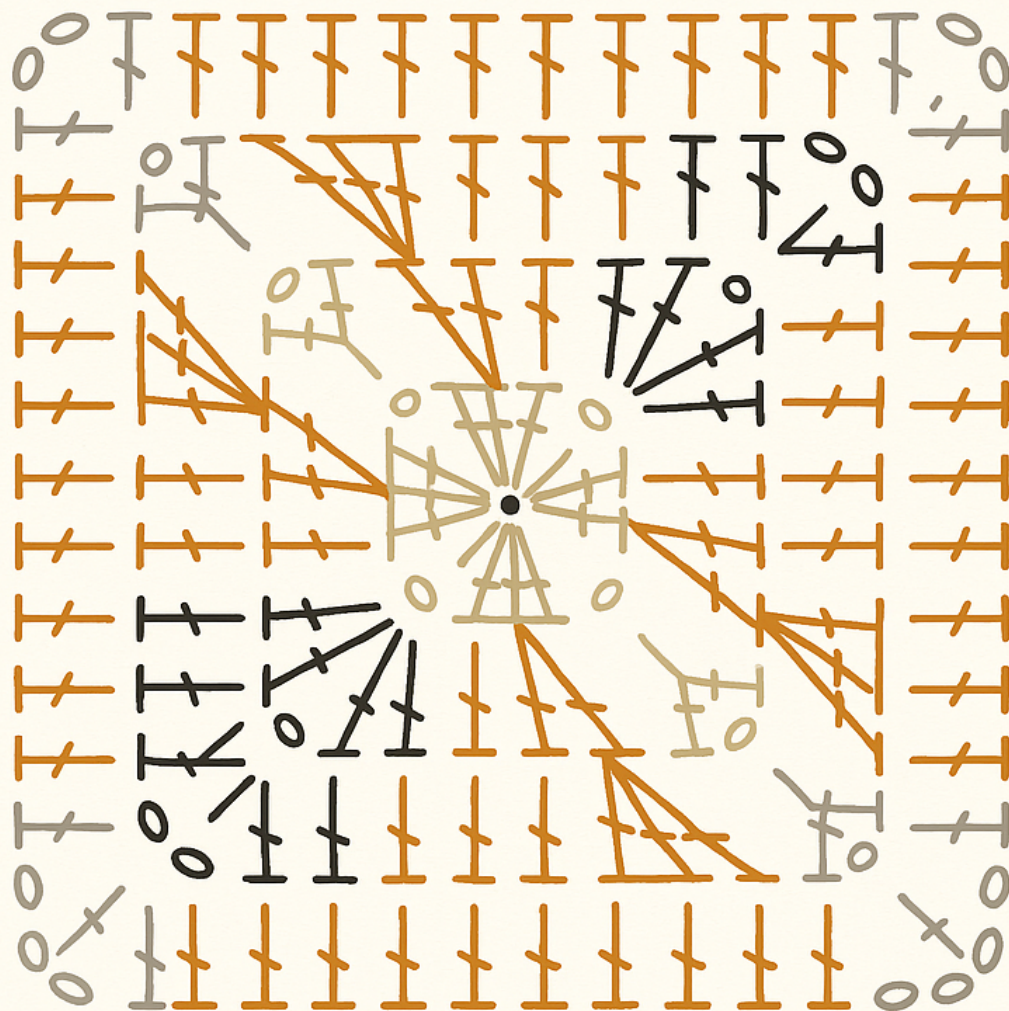
Finished Mitered Granny Square Example
