
Stitches & Terms

BIAS: cut diagonally on a 45° angle

PINKING SHEARS: fabric scissors that cut a zigzag





Finishing

13. Position & pin handle and base onto the teacup making sure it is balanced. Attach the base securely in place using a *ladder stitch*.



14. Using floss, attach the top of the handle with a large 'X' and sew through the button at the bottom of the handle. Make a collection & invite your friends for a tea party!



QUILTED TEACUP

finished size: 4 inches tall with a 6½" saucer

Use 1/4" seam allowance unless otherwise stated.

Please read all of the instructions before starting your project.

Cutting

From fabric A, cut:

- 5 teacup bottom on the bias
- 1 saucer
- 1 8" x 2" bias strip with straight ends for handle
- $1 6\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2" bias strip with straight ends for teacup base

From fabric B, cut:

- 5 *teacup top* on the bias
- $2 4\frac{1}{2} \times 4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares for saucer centre

From fabric C, cut & piece together:


- 1 15"x 2" bias strip with angled ends for rim of cup
- 1 22" x 2" bias strip with angled ends for rim of saucer

From lining fabric, cut:

- 1 8 x 8" square for saucer backing
- 5 teacup lining on the bias


From batting, cut:

- 1 8 x 8" square
- 5 *teacup lining* using a template cut from felt (the felt template will stick to the batting)




Handle & Base

1. Fold the *bias* strip in half lengthwise and sew using a $\frac{3}{8}$ " allowance. Trim seam to $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Pass the safety pin with string attached through the tube and attach the pin to the other end of the tube. Pull the pin back through turning the fabric tube right side out.




2. Pass the safety pin through tube again and attach it to the end of the piping that has been wrapped with masking tape. Pull the piping through the tube & trim. *TIP: You can use several strands of yarn folded in half in place of piping.*




Binding


11. Press each binding strip in half lengthwise. Unfold and press edges to the centre crease. Unfold.




12. Fold the bias strips ¼" in at one end and with right sides together, pin along the outer edge of the teacup rim & saucer. Sew through all the layers using a ¾" seam allowance. Fold over to back & sew in place using a blindstitch.




9. Layer the saucer circle over the batting & backing. Position and pin the prepared saucer centre on the larger circle. Topstitch $\frac{1}{8}$ " in from the edge of the smaller circle. Sew 3 more circles inside the first circle $\frac{1}{4}$ " apart.



10. Baste ¼" from unfinished edge. Trim excess batting & backing. With 6 strands of floss, embroider around the edge of the smaller circle using a running stitch. Embroider a *lazy daisy* in the centre.




3. For handle: tuck the fabric in at the ends and whipstitch closed to form a rounded shape. For base: undo $\frac{3}{4}$ " of the stitching at one end of the tube, trim off $\frac{3}{4}$ " of the piping, and fold the fabric in $\frac{1}{4}$ " at end. Insert the full end of the tube into the empty end, pin to secure and *blindstitch* together.




Piece & Assemble


4. With right sides together, join teacup bottom & teacup top. Press seams open. Centre ribbon over seam and topstitch in place. Trim excess. Repeat for all 5 sides.



5. With right sides together, pin two sides together aligning the ribbon. Sew from the top to the dot marked on the templates. Join all sides together to form a cup shape. Press seams open. Repeat with lining. *Whipstitch* the batting together.




6. Slip the lining wrong side out over a ball or your fist. Slip the batting over the lining. Finally, slip the outer shell right side out over the batting matching up the seams to the seams in the lining.




Quilt & Embroider


7. Starting at the bottom of the cup, quilt along the seams using a *running stitch* and 6 strands of floss matching up the seams on both sides. Trim excess batting & lining.




Saucer

8. With right sides together, trace the *saucer centre* on the $4\frac{1}{2} \times 4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. Sew along the entire line. Trim seam to $\frac{1}{8}$ " using pinking shears or cut notches along curves. Carefully cut a slit in one side and turn right side out using a turning tool. Press.

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BOOKLET ASSEMBLY

Instructions for assembling the pattern booklet.

Method #1 (best results)

Print the cover on high quality professional matte photo $8^{1/2}$ x 11" paper using a borderless setting. Print the page with Stitches & Terms on the back of the cover page. Print the page with Cutting Instructions and the page with steps 1, 2, 11 & 12 on opposite sides of the same paper. Print the page with 9, 10, 3 & 4 and the page with steps 5 - 8 on opposite sides of same paper. Fold so that pages are in the correct order. Tie pages together with a couple stitches at the fold.

Method #2

Print each page on a different piece of paper. Layer pages on top of each other as follows: Cover face down; page with Stitches & Terms face up; page with Cutting Instructions face down; page with steps 1, 2, 11 & 12 face up; page with steps 9, 10, 3 & 4 face down; page with steps 5 - 8 face up. Fold all pages in half towards you and tie pages together with a couple stitches at the fold.

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
